Some reflections on my 16 years (and counting) at NMC

N November 2021 Richard (he's been our NMC postman for over 20 years) delivered a letter to me at NMC. It was an envelope endorsed OHMS – On Her Majesty's Service. I naturally assumed it was a tax demand!

Turns out it was a letter from The Cabinet Office informing me I'd been awarded an OBE for service to those affected by neuromuscular conditions and asking me if I'd accept it.

I couldn't quite believe it. I was to keep all this a secret until formal announcement in the New Year's Honours.

I could hear my dad's voice in my head telling a young Matthew that OBE stood for Other Buggers' Efforts! no longer alive, but he would have been beyond proud, as is my 93-year-old mum. She is a great family history researcher and has traced our family tree back for centuries. When the OBE was finally made public, mum was quick to confirm that not one of my ancestors had ever been honoured despite their prowess as tailors, smugglers, shipwrights, oystermen, farmers, and brewers. She ordered a copy of The Times from her village newsagent so that she could see it in print and believe it!

It was May 2005 when I was having a browse through job vacancies to se if anything floated my boat. An advert in the Manchester Evening News caught my eye. I made a call to Sarah Kelly (NMC's founder) and suggested that I couldn't possibly be what the NMC was looking for in a new leader, but apparently, I was.

The NMC has changed a lot in the last 16 years but the key elements, our ethos and culture, and our focus what people can do, remain steadfastly the same.

It's always immensely rewarding, and great fun, steering NMC towards some major new development. It's not always joyous at NMC though. Along the way we've had our sad times too. We've lost some pivotal people over the years, and I shan't ever forget them and the contribution each of them made to our culture and our work. The thing about NMC is how a collective enthusiasm keeps the place driving forward whatever is thrown

at us. If I've been able to do anything, it's been to harness the power and potential of that enthusiasm to make some good things happen. We've been blessed with some world class fundraisers, incredibly loyal and active supporters, and a squad of talented volunteers always keen to pitch up and help.

We fenced our newly enlarged site and created the driveway off the lane that we have today. I love how we've developed our outdoor space. I remember the time when we had no outdoor space except a small and inadequate car park.




Building a great team. Some amazing staff have joined NMC, and we've seen many in our wider community flourish and grow.




